As we now break from our series Being church I thought it might be helpful to take stock and reflect on what we have covered before we head for advent.

1. Church of **Ephesus** (Revelation 2:1–7). **Sunday 14**th **September**

Key picture - Jesus walking watchfully amongst the lamp stands

Theme: Orthodoxy without love

Q1. In what ways might I be "doing the right things" for God while neglecting my love for Him or for people?

Q2. What specific practices can I return to that once helped nurture my love for Christ?

2. Church of **Smyrna** (Revelation 2:8–11). **Sunday 21st September**

Key picture - Christine as conqueror. Jesus is the first and the last who died and is alive

Theme: Faithfulness in suffering

Q1. How do I respond to pressure, hardship, or opposition because of my faith—fearfully or faithfully?

Q2. What fears currently challenge my trust in God, and how might remembering Christ's victory help me endure?

3. Church of Pergamum (Revelation 2:12-17). Sunday 5th October

Key picture - Jesus as the warrior prophet, with the double edged sword coming out of His mouth

Theme: Holding fast while resisting compromise

Q1. Where am I tempted to compromise my beliefs or values to fit cultural expectations?

Q2. What false teachings, influences, or habits have subtly shaped my thinking, and what steps can I take to realign with truth?

4. Church of Thyatira (Revelation 2:18-29) Sunday 19th October

Key picture - king Jesus the one with all authority - eyes of flaming fire and feet of burnished bronze

Theme: Love and service mixed with tolerance of sin

Q1. Is there anything in my life or community that I excuse or tolerate, even though I know it leads away from God?

Q2. How can I grow in discernment so that my love and service are also aligned with holiness?

5. Church of Sardis (Revelation 3:1-6). Sunday 9th November

Theme: Reputation vs. reality—spiritual sleepiness and complacency Key picture - Jesus holding the seven stars (the messengers) and the seven spirits (the perfect Holy Spirit) in his hand.

Q1. Are there areas in my spiritual life where I appear "alive" outwardly but am actually stagnant or complacent?

Q2. What specific actions would help me "wake up" and strengthen the things in my life that are spiritually weak or dying?



Kintsugi Hope at Avendale and Drumclog

I would like to share some information about a Wellbeing Group I am planning to run from January to March 2026.

As many of you know, our church partners with a Christian Charity called Kintsugi Hope, who work with Churches and other Christian organisations across the UK to support emotional health and wellbeing. They do this by supporting churches to run Kintsugi Wellbeing Groups.

These groups offer a safe, welcoming space for anyone who wants to build a better sense of their own wellbeing. I am a trained group leader and have already led two groups within our church, both of which were women only. Dependant on interest, the next group can be women only, men only or mixed.

I'd like to share a few comments from past participants -

"The course helped me understand myself and my reactions to the ups and downs of daily life better. The course material was a good base for our discussions and everyone was supportive."

"The course has taught me strategies which I can apply now to situations I encounter more positively. It has been an extremely beneficial, positive experience, helping me to reassess how I deal with life."

"I hope and pray more people will take up the opportunity to attend the Kintsugi course. I for one will definitely recommend it."



Fairtrade Update

The Fairtrade Group in Strathaven is very small (if you might be interested in joining us, you will be warmly welcomed!), but continues to work, promoting and encouraging businesses and customers to think "fair trade" in their buying and selling decisions. The Scottish Fairtrade Forum, our umbrella organization, also promotes support for local producers, environmentally- aware production as well as trying to end international trade injustice, which has long seen Western nation benefit from staple produce at a low price, while exploiting the work of producers in poorer parts of the world.

Fair trade has gone from a fringe campaign into the mainstream, over the last 40-50 years, and Fairly and ethically traded goods are available in many of our local shops, and, although we no longer have a Fairtrade stall here at Avendale, the Kirk Session has supported the use of Fair Trade marked tea, coffee and sugar for all our use in our church. Now that Sainsburys have a wide range of Fairtrade coffees and teas, I purchase those there.

Can I request that those generous people who sometimes donate tea or coffee please buy only tea and coffee with the Fair trade mark?

Meanwhile the local group have recently had a new bench put into position in the Common Green, between the postbox and the bus stop- it has been designed by a local business, with input from Strathaven Academy pupils, and the help of South Lanarkshire Council. We are grateful to the funding body, Point North who awarded us the grant to make this possible. Look out for the bench next time you are there.

Even more excitingly, we are well on our way to having a large mural, in a central position, which marks Strathaven's long history of being a Fairtrade town. This has been a long road to seek appropriate permissions, find the best location, achieve funding and seek out an artistic team to bring the design to life. This month Spectrum Arts Group from Edinburgh, are holding workshops here in Strathaven with children with from all the local schools, so that this will be a truly community driven project.

If you are thinking about fair trade goods for Christmas gifts and need help sourcing suppliers, talk to me and I will try to help. And please consider joining our local group- nothing too arduous, but we could really do with a few more on the team!
